

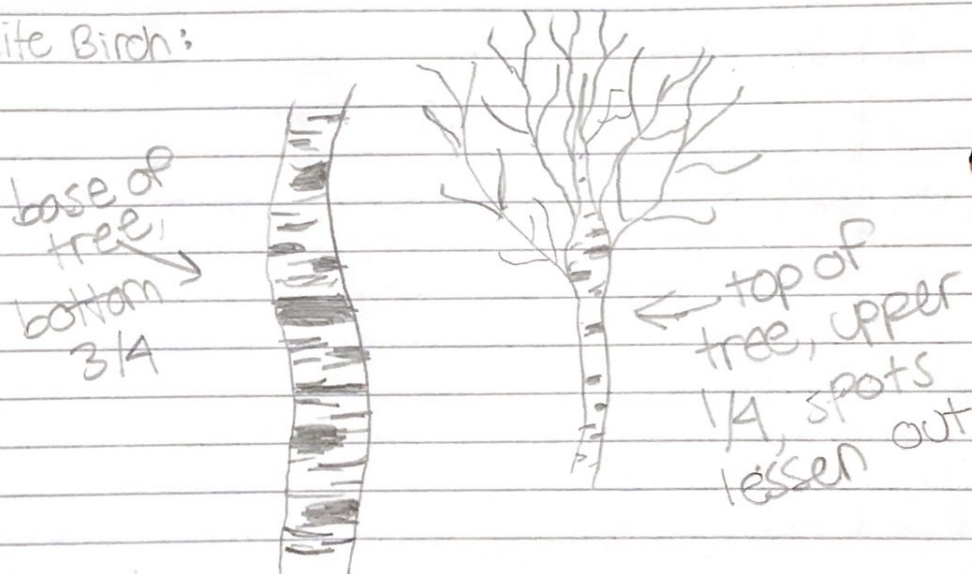

White and black bark = white birch trees
Number along gradient: 15

White Birch (*Betula papyrifera*)

- bark can sometimes appear to be peeling
- trees for the most part point straight up
- Few branches for the first $\frac{3}{4}$ of the tree, much more branching in the last $\frac{1}{4}$
- black and white strips on the bark

White Birch:



Beaked Hazelnut (*Corylus cornuta*)

- brown bark
- highly branched
- found closer to the water
- some small bulbs on the bush branches, not many though
